What is this product?

Type

This product is a UCITS sub-fund of Brown Advisory Funds Plc. The Fund's assets are held through its Depository, which is Brown Brothers Harriman Trustee Services (Ireland) Limited.

Investment Objective

The Fund aims to achieve capital growth.

Investment Policy

The Fund aims to achieve its investment objective by investing at least 80% of its net assets in equity securities of US companies that the Investment Manager considers have sound fundamentals and business models which are sustainable over the long-term. The Fund invests primarily in the securities of medium and large capitalisation companies that the Investment Manager considers (1) have prospects for above average earnings growth in the future, and (2) effectively implement sustainable business strategies that drive earnings growth. The equity securities in which the Fund principally invests are common stocks. The Fund may also invest in non-US securities, American and Global Depository Receipts, US treasury bills, fixed and/or floating rate US government securities, real estate investment trusts and unlisted securities.

Medium and large capitalisation companies are, according to the Investment Manager, those companies with market capitalisations generally greater than \$2 billion at the time of purchase. The Fund may also invest a portion of the portfolio in equity securities of small market capitalisation companies.

The Investment Manager has determined that the Fund is an Article 8 financial product for the purposes of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 November 2019 on sustainability-related disclosures in the financial services sector (SFDR). The equity securities in which the Fund invests are screened based on certain SRI criteria in accordance with various principles set out in declarations and conventions signed by the international community, including, but not limited to, the ten United Nations Global Compact Principles whose purpose is to increase awareness of a sustainable

global economy at company level. Equity securities issued by companies violating such principles and not addressing such violations adequately will not be included in the Fund's portfolio. Other criteria may, as necessary, apply in developing "socially responsible" screens.

Benchmark

The Fund uses the Russell 1000 Growth index as a Comparator Benchmark to compare performance. The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by any benchmark.

Dealing Frequency

Investors may redeem shares on demand on any day (except Saturday or Sunday) on which the New York Stock Exchange is open.

Distribution Policy

The Fund does not intend to distribute income on your shares. The price of your shares shall rise by the net income earned per share.

Intended Investor

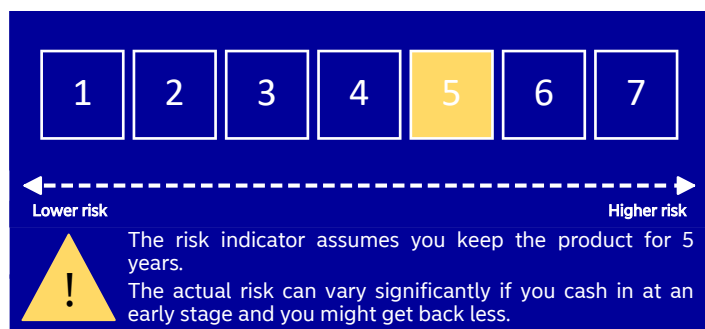

Risk Indicator

The fund is not intended for short term speculation purposes.
